In her practice — on a daily basis — Schwartz educates people on how to protect themselves under the law, whether it be helping people fulfill their dreams of adopting a child or, in a healthy holistic way, put closure in their lives, it all comes from a social justice perspective.

Schwartz is compassionate and driven to help those in need. Whether motivated to giving her parents nachas, or the importance of being an activist in our community Schwartz says, "I want to put my head down on the pillow at night and know I help people resolve their problems in a healthy way. Being able to marry my politics and my practice is satisfying to the brain and heart, it nourishes my soul."
